ABOUT US

- Gándara's Esperanza Women's Transitional Support Services is a short-term residential program for women who need a safe and structured environment to support their recovery process after detoxification.
- This program is designed to help those who need services between acute treatment and residential rehabilitation, outpatient or other aftercare.
- Eligibility: 18 or older who are referred by a publicly funded ATS (detox) program, homeless shelters, or homeless outreach workers hospitals, clinics, and self-referrals.

OUR MISSION

Gándara Center's mission is to promote the well-being of Hispanics, African-Americans and other diverse populations through innovative, culturally competent behavioral health, prevention, and education services. Our programs address this mission through the delivery of participant-driven, evidence and strength-based residential recovery, supported housing, case management, behavioral health, peer recovery,

and health care services. The target populations for these services include persons in recovery from opioid addiction, pregnant and postpartum women, pregnant opioid MAT users, recovery families and re-entry individuals.



TRAUMA INFORMED CARE

An approach that aims to engage people with histories of trauma, recognize the presence of trauma symptoms, and acknowledge the role that trauma has played in their lives.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

Gándara Esperanza Women's Transitional Support Service is funded by the Department of Public Health and Bureau of Substance Abuse Services.

Criteria for admission:

- Age 18 years or older
- Resident of Massachusetts
- Priority for admission includes: Hispanic, African American, LGBTQ, pregnant/postpartum, homeless, involved with the criminal justice system, with disabilities, and/or living with HIV/AIDS
- Demonstrate a commitment to sobriety
- Demonstrate an understanding that participation includes the development of a treatment plan
- Be willing to complete an eligibility assessment
- Applicants on Medication Assisted Treatment or other medications will not be denied treatment
